

Maryland and Local Government Share of CV 3.0 Emergency Funding

- 1. Coronavirus Relief Fund (Established under the Department of the Treasury) – \$2.34 billion of \$150 billion (Tax Foundation) – Local govts must apply for the funding out of the State share**
  - i. State of Maryland Remainder- \$1,652,391,000
  - ii. Montgomery County - \$181,116,000
  - iii. Prince George’s County - \$156,897,000
  - iv. Baltimore County - \$144,261,000
  - v. Baltimore City - \$106,353,000
  - vi. Anne Arundel County - \$98,982,000
  
- 2. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) – \$30.89 million total of \$5 billion. *The bill allows previously awarded FY19 and upcoming FY20 CDBG awards to meet COVID-19 needs, as well as allow CDBG recipients to be reimbursed for COVID-19 response activities, regardless of when the cost was incurred prior to the awarding of this new emergency supplemental funding being enacted/distributed.***
  - a. Maryland Nonentitlement - \$4,699,844
    - i. These funds are distributed to smaller counties (Washington, Caroline) by the State
  - b. Anne Arundel County - \$1,248,862
    - i. Annapolis - \$156,727 (This is in addition to the \$1.248 million AACO receives)
  - c. Baltimore City - \$13,107,682
  - d. Baltimore County - \$2,466,365
  - e. Harford County - \$641,426
  - f. Howard County - \$770,729
  - g. Montgomery County - \$2,956,531
    - i. Gaithersburg - \$266,028 (This is in addition to the Montgomery County share)
  - h. Prince George’s County - \$3,038,427
    - i. Bowie City - \$116,919 (This is in addition to the Prince George’s County share)
  - i. Cumberland - \$476,457
  - j. Frederick - \$243,541
  - k. Hagerstown - \$473,080
  - l. Salisbury - \$228,016
  
- 3. FEMA Disaster Relief Fund - \$45 billion available nationwide. Access to these funds require a national disaster declaration, this funding will reimburse the State/locals so we do not have a Maryland share.**
  
- 4. Public Health and Social Services Emergency Fund - \$100 billion available nationwide, we do not have a Maryland share for this account as it will reimburse spending, it is not distributed on a formula.**
  
- 5. Community Health Centers (CHCs) and Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) - \$1.32 billion available nationwide, a Maryland share is not available yet but it will eventually be distributed on a formula.**
  
- 6. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention preparation and response to COVID - \$4.3 billion nationwide. A Maryland share is not available yet.**

- 7. State and Local Preparedness Grants - \$11.399 million minimum share of the \$1.5 billion national account.**
- 8. Federal Transit Administration Formulas – \$695.418 million total of \$25 billion, provided under a 100 percent federal cost share with no local match requirement, the funds are intended to cover operations and lost revenue.** This will provide funding to transit systems across the state, including WMATA and local transit systems, including those in the City.
- 9. K-12 Education - \$253.515 million total of \$16.5 billion**
- 10. DOJ Byrne Justice Assistance Grant – \$17.276 million total from \$850 million**
  - a. \$10.366 million for the State
  - b. \$6.9 million for local needs, do not yet have which locals will receive this funding
- 11. Election Assistance Grants - \$7.793 million total, all funds are provided to the state to distribute**
- 12. Child Care and Development Block Grants - \$45.484 million of \$3.5 billion nationwide. Combined with the FY20 enacted funding, this provides MD a \$118.428 million share.**
- 13. Community Services Block Grant - \$12.749 million of a \$1 billion available nationwide.**
